The Noori Family Collection

Our Gallery Coordinator Chloe King had the opportunity to interview Frank Noori, supportive husband and business partner to our Gallery Owner Sanaz Noori. Their discussion encompassed Frank's extensive collection of historical Persian currencies, medals, and instruments; a synopsis of this conversation is as follows.

With more than 2,500 years of historical significance, each piece is a work of art and has a story to tell. His favorite paper currencies are from the Persian Qajar Empire because they were the first to be issued in Persia in the late 1800's. Frank explained that some of these paper bills are worth more than 1,000,000% of their face value. For the coin currencies, his favorites span from the 5th century BC to 2nd century AD. These gold and silver coins were produced under the Achaemenid, Parthian, and Sasanian empires as well as the Kings of Persis. Some of these coins are worth more than 1,000% of their melt value.

Frank has traveled to many countries and purchased some items overseas but most of the items were purchased in the U.S. from collectors and antique dealers. With a few pieces being gifted to him by family and friends, he explained that is what got him hooked on collecting. When he receives a gift and researches the history behind it, he always finds himself wanting to discover more items that possess an artistic quality as well as historical significance.

Frank passionately expressed his gratitude for his ability to obtain so many precious items and his hope of passing them down to the next generation. While he is willing to sell some items in the future, he expressed it must be at the right time and to just the right person that will appreciate them as much as he does.
