Many people find this medium very difficult as it is much harder to control where the paint goes onto the page as water flows more freely than acrylic. Their first lesson with watercolor explored value - a great way to introduce what it takes to control the watercolor medium. They each made a value scale with rich dark pigment on one end of the page and little to no pigment at the other end. This exercise made them really think about the ratio of water to pigment used as well as the precise location of where to place the medium. Each class session provides the kids with the opportunity to learn a new technique, effectively developing their skills quickly while having fun! Your child can join our class today! # Art of the month

## Mahsa Amini

This pastel pencil portrait by Sanaz Noori, rendered on sanded cart, was created in honor of the first anniversary of Mahsa Amini's death and the emergence of the "Woman, Life, Freedom" movement in Iran. The artwork captures Mahsa with a gentle yet powerful expression, draped in the pre-revolutionary Iranian flag — a symbol of national identity and resistance. She is surrounded by angelic figures, evoking a sense of peace, protection, and the spiritual weight of her legacy. The soft yet vivid texture of pastel pencils enhances the emotional depth and warmth of the composition, making it both a tribute and a visual voice for a movement rooted in courage and hope.



#### Did You Know?

Pastel pencils combine the vibrancy of soft pastels with the control of a pencil, making them a favorite among artists for detailed work. They're perfect for blending soft textures while still allowing for precision in portraits, hair, or fine lines. To get the best results, many artists use them on sanded paper, which grips the pigment and enhances layering. A helpful tip: keep your pastel pencils sharp using sandpaper blocks rather than regular sharpeners to avoid breakage and preserve their shape!
